practices that the church and the dominant culture continue to uphold and accept. He asked God to open our hearts to change.

Second is the Report on Ministry in the Pandemic. Carol said we learned that we were resilient. We learned new skills, connected via Facebook and Zoom, shared what we have, and that church is more than just gathering on Sunday.

Lastly, the Report on Local Church Disaster Response & Preparedness was discussed. It is

important to be prepared for any disaster: 115 degrees, fire, smoke, flooding, avalanches, earthquakes, volcanic eruptions. Oregon has experienced many such disasters. The Board will consider ways we can be better prepared to help our congregation and community.
