HISTORIAN NEWS – Let's Keep in Touch!

The historian scrapbook on display for May spans the years 1947 through 1967. It was interesting to read about the early years of Wilshire United Methodist Church. The parsonage, now home to Pastor Allen and family was dedicated in September of 1953. Pictures in the scrapbook illustrated the building of the Sanctuary addition to the original structure, breaking ground in 1960, and a crane to raise the copper steeple in 1961.
